Section 3: Building a Community

Section 4: Eligibility Requirements

- All dogs must be healthy and have current vaccinations
- All teams must be looking to compete, correctly competing, or working professionally.

Section 4: Club Structure

Frequency: Club will take place every other Saturday of the month (2 club meet ups each month)

Section 5: Attendance/Involvement

- Regular attendance is expected unless you have let training director know you cannot make it that week.
- The club will meet for group discussion and footage review quarterly/goal setting quarterly.
 Meeting times and location tbd but should most definitely include ability to bring or purchase beer and food.

Section 6: Etiquette

- If you're not 15 min early you're late. We expect everyone to be on time for club and stay late to help clean and put facility back together from club.
- Session goals should be discussed prior to club with training director so when it is your turn to go there is a clear goal.
- Suggestions/feedback for the team should be reserved for when handler specifically asks for advice or quarterly group discussion. Want to avoid too much feedback being given in the moment while handler is working with dog.
- As teams get closer to trials, I want to try and have as many club members go to that trial as possible. Show as much of a unified and supportive front as possible.
- You K9 should be safely secured in your vehicle. If you are private or civilian we do expect your dog to be in a kennel not free ranging your vehicle
